# **WOMEN IN CHINA II:**

## A NEW BIBLIOGRAPHY OF AVAILABLE ENGLISH LANGUAGE MATERIALS PROGRESS REPORT

Women in China: A Bibliography of Available English Language Materials compiled and edited by Lucie Cheng, Charlotte Furth, and Hon-ming Yip was published by the Center for Chinese Studies of the University of California, Berkeley in 1984. The annotated Bibliography includes materials published before 1981. In spite of its many shortcomings, it is still widely considered as one of the most useful reference tools for students and scholars working in this field. With the rising interest in Women Studies, an increasing number of works on women in China have been published since 1981. Given the expansion of the field, an update of the Bibliography seems in order.

As part of the Women's History Project, the Institute of Modern Chinese History gave me the responsibility to bring the *Bibliography* to date. Hsien-huei Liao, Ya-mei Wang and Marian Katz, all graduate students at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) have been engaged to assist me in this project. The new bibliography will follow basically the format of the previous edition, and is to include

books, book chapters, articles, dissertations and theses on Chinese women between 1600 and 1990 published or completed since 1981. We hope to have a manuscript by the end of June, 1993.

With the assistance of Liao, Wang and Katz, I am pleased to present a progress report on the project.

#### Procedure

We began the project in August, 1992, and developed a plan of action with the help of Professors Susan Mann and Chia-lin Bao Tao. Some slight adjustments were made to the categorization schema on the basis of feedback from users of the first edition. After an investigation of several software programs, we decided to adopt Procite which allows almost unlimited expansion of categorization and annotation.

The three assistants agreed on a division of labor. Hsien-huei Liao is responsible for the general setup and collection of books and dissertations; Ya-mei Wang is to search for relevant articles and book chapters; and Marian Katz is responsible for additional bibliographic searches. All three carried out their duties with the utmost seriousness and professionalism.

#### **Format**

Following the general format adopted in the first edition, for each item in the Bibliography-in-Progress (BIP) we recorded author, title, place of publication, publisher, date of publication and all standard bibliographic information. In addition, we categorized each entry according to the geographic location, time period and content foci of the subject matter. The Procite program allows us to retrieve items by any of the above bibliographic categories and their combinations.

We have just begun to provide annotations for the entries. As a first step, we are trying to rewrite and abstract from book reviews, book jackets, etc. We have also asked scholars to write brief annotations for works with which they are familiar. We hope readers of this Progress Report will assist us by providing annotations.

#### **Current Status of BIP**

As of April 15, we have entered a total of 1041 items, of which 282 are monographs, 184 are dissertations, 159 are book chapters, and 416 are journal articles. Table 1 and the accompanying figure summarize this information by date of publication. Since the BIP is still incomplete, especially in terms of journal articles and book chapters, it is not correct to draw any inference from the current data. Suffice it to say that there seems to have been a steady and encouraging increase of works on women in China since 1981.

In terms of subject matter, as Table 2 indicates, most of the works published tend to focus on a few subjects: health and population, marriage and family, and literature. Again, we want to caution the reader that this may be misleading. We intend to present an analysis of the project once data collection is complete.
